Fable are short, pithy animal tales meant to teach a moral lesson, often ending with a proverb stating the moral outright: "Beauty is in the eye of the beholder," "A man is known by the company

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he keeps," or "Slow and steady wins the race," for example. They are constructed to provide both a narrative illustration of and compelling argument for the lessons they convey.
